Honour a media person, state or local politician or businessperson with this sophisticated and elegant award. Featuring a glass piece with a bevelled edge that fits into a beautiful rosewood finished base.

Have you been thinking about a hero you would like to nominate for the District 60 Communication and Leadership Award for 2022?

The purpose of the communication and leadership awards is to honour a non-toastmaster who has made substantial contributions in communication and leadership.

How to nominate someone for the Communication and Leadership Award nomination?

Criteria for the Award Recipient

Following are the criteria used for the award recipient selection.

- Must be a resident of the geographical area covered by District 60.
- Currently must be a non-Toastmaster, can be a former Toastmaster.
- They should have distinguished themselves as leaders or spokespersons for a worthy cause or purpose, especially as it exemplified their communication and leadership skills.
- Shall have made a significant contribution to their community within District 60. The impact of this contribution must not be limited to one organization but must be community/district-wide.
- This award may not be presented to a recipient a second time.
- Must be able to personally accept the award and give an acceptance address at the District 60 Annual Conference on April 30, 2022 or record a video acceptance 2-3 minutes.

Nomination Process

1. Any District 60 Toastmaster in good standing may submit a nomination for the award. If you wish to nominate more than one person, please submit separate entries for each individual. The Nomination Form and any supplemental information should be sent to the PRM using the format provided on the Nomination Form.
2. Nominations must be made in writing following the questions on the Nomination Form, providing reasons why the nominee should be considered for the award.
3. Nominations must be submitted to the District PRM by the published nominations due date. Calling for nominations starts now, and the nomination deadline is February 15, 2022.
4. The TRIO will only consider nominations submitted by the due date.
5. The TRIO will decide which nominee, if any, is worthy of the award. A majority vote will make the decision. This vote may be performed via email.
6. If most of the TRIO feels that no nominations merit the award, then no award will be made for that year.
7. If an award is to be given, the District 60 Director will contact the recipient to inform them that they have been selected to receive the award and advise the recipient that they must make an acceptance address at the District Annual Conference as a condition of receiving the award.
8. If the chosen recipient:
 - Cannot make an acceptance address
 - Cannot personally accept the award
 - Chooses not to accept the award
9. On the award announcement date, the District 60 Director will announce the award recipient or announce that there will not be an award presented that year.

10. Any Toastmaster may nominate a recipient. If you wish to nominate more than one person, please submit separate entries for each individual. The Nomination Form, along with any supplemental information, should be sent to the Public Relations Manager (PRM@Toastmasters60.com) using the format provided on the Nomination Form. Deadline: February 15, 2022

Then the TRIO may choose to select another recipient for the award that year. If another recipient is chosen, then the District 60 Director will contact that individual in accordance with #7 above.

The Selection

The selection of the recipient for the award is made by the TRIO and confirmed by the District Director. Selection is contingent upon the recipient's confirmed attendance for the award presentation.

Presentation

The Communication and Leadership award will be presented at the District 60 Annual Conference.

The award is given in the form of a plaque, purchased by District 60 from Toastmasters International, and appropriately engraved with the winner's name, year of the award, name of the award, and other pertinent information.
